Entries

- Every FINA National Federation is allowed to compete (this does not apply to suspended National Federations).
- Should a National Federation enter several solos, duets, mixed duets or team events with members of their national delegation, only the highest ranked solos, duets, mixed duets or team in each event will be considered for the Series' results and rankings. The National Federations may enter different athletes in the solo, duet, mixed duet and team events of the various legs of the Series they wish to take part in.
- For World Series only, it is possible to have up to two (2) male swimmers as part of the team in the highlight and free combination events.
- All Federations participating in the competitions of the World Series must be registered by their National
 Federation in the FINA GMS in accordance with the deadlines. As mentioned above, National Federations may
 enter more than one solo, duet, mixed duet and/or team. In this case, they will be identified numerically. E.g.
 AUT 1, AUT 2, AUT 3, etc.
- Entries are to be submitted through the GMS according to the deadlines for National Federations, except for male solo entries which should be registered directly through OC by contacting Stéphane Côté at stephane@artisticswimming.ca.

Every participating NF must provide an A or a G judge to every meet they enter, up to a maximum of two (2) judges. The A or G judge must have successfully passed the Judges Exam administered at a FINA Artistic Swimming Judges Certification School, the online annual exam and be on the current FINA List. The list of judges for each competition should be sent in advance to FINA.

Practice Judges: because of the complicated technical nature of virtual events, no practices judges will be allowed.





Additional Considerations:

- Have a strong working knowledge of English
- Own a laptop running an operating system that allows for multiple windows for judging of all videos, and being comfortable using it without supervision
- Use a mobile phone during the competition as directed by the Organizing Committee for communication purposes.
- Be technically proficient and able to work efficiently in a virtual platform using applications such as WhatsApp, Google Forms, etc.
- Please note that mobile phones are NOT permitted for judging videos.
- Judge nomination form and conflict of interest forms must be submitted by January 18. Late submissions will not be accepted.
- Judges must indicate availability for each of the judging dates. We will consider time zones when creating the schedule.
- Judges should wear a white-collar shirt during judge days.

Mandatory Judge Information & Training: The mandatory Judge Meeting & Training will be February 19, 2022 at 10:00 AM ET. Every nominated judge is required to attend this meeting. The meeting will be approximately two hours long.

Prior to the mandatory Judge meeting, each judge will be required to create an account with Integrated Sports Systems (ISS) U-Judge system. A tutorial on how to score live using the U-Judge system will be given at the Judge Training Sessions, and a full judging simulation will also be conducted.

Judges need to use a computer or laptop running an operating system that allows for streaming video and be comfortable using it without supervision. The computer or laptop must have a physical connection to the internet using an ethernet cable. A wireless connection is not suitable for streaming routine videos.

Routine judging will be **February 26 – 27, 2022** and follow the event schedule below. End times will be determined after registration has closed for Federations.

Sport Presentation

Every participation National Federation is required to inform the LOC of the following information, using the *form* available on the event page:

- * Short presentation of the athletes and the coach
- Explain the choice of music and its meaning to the athlete(s)
- * Solo, duet or team's best achievements
- * Solo, duet or team's goals for this event and goals for the future
- * For solo and duet: give some information about the athletes (studies, main interests)
- Please provide at least one fun fact about the swimmers, the team and/or the coach.





This information will be used by the commentators after the routines and will help the audience to connect with the athletes. You are kindly requested to send one (1) package per Federation with the forms labelled: **Country code_year_event**

The information sent to us will be stored by FINA to be used by each LOC of the Series. Should your information change (choice of music for example) please send us a new form so that the information can be updated for the next organisers.

Gala Show

An Exhibition Gala will be presented at the end of the broadcast. All delegations are asked to participate in this final gala as it is one of the main ways to develop and promote our sport. Solo, duet, trio, accessories, improvisations, make up - everything is allowed to make this Exhibition Gala a spectacular show to finish the event.

Please plan for and Exhibition Gala Show routine which is different from the competition routines and lasts a maximum of 2 minutes. The deadline to upload this routine and to submit the **Gala Information Form is February 27, 2021**. Please make sure to include your Country Code in the label of your gala video file and upload it by the deadline *using this upload link*.

Video Information

It is <u>strongly encouraged</u> that you test out your camera and sound equipment prior to recording your routine to ensure you are capturing the best video and sound quality.		
Routine Video	A full video of each routine must be filmed, without interruption, using filming guide- lines below. The video must be non-edited (continuous) and include a full walk-on and must also capture all the athletes getting out of the water and get back up to the start- ing platform, just like in a regular competition. Once back on the start deck, athletes should stay in position and wave to the camera for at least 30 seconds.	
	Whenever possible, videos should be filmed inside, to avoid the glare that comes with exterior pools.	
Performance Window	In order to simulate an on-demand competition environment, the video must be filmed within an allowed filming window (see information below).	
Submitting Videos	All videos must be submitted before the final submission deadline they have been assigned. A link for submission will be provided directly to the federation.	
Video Resolution	All videos must be filmed at a resolution of 1080p HD, at 30 frames per second (fps).	
Position for Filming	The person in charge of filming the video should be at the side of the pool, exactly in the middle (at 12.5m for 25 m pools), 1m from the water edge, with the starting platform to their right. The camera should be elevated to 1.8m (6 ft) from the ground, which is the average height from which judges watch routines. Whenever possible, tripods should be used.	
Zooming	Zooming during the routine is allowed but should be used carefully to make sure all athletes are always visible during the entire routine. The basic idea should always be to make your routine look its best.	
	It's also important that your recording angle is not so wide that it becomes impossible to view the athletes properly. If you can see the entire width of the field of play when you start, you have probably zoomed out too much. A good basic starting point is to set up your camera so that the middle of the pool is at left-most edge of the video and the starting position at the right-most edge. You can then adjust zoom appropriately from there. as the routine unfolds.	
Suggested Equipment	A high-resolution camera is highly recommended in order to ensure quality and ability to zoom. Camera should be mounted on a tripod to ensure stability. Most common DSLR cameras will allow	





	you to capture the quality needed for this event. Cell phones, tablets and GoPros are NOT recommended. It may also be worthwhile to rent a camera or hire a professional videographer.	
Sound	It is recommended that sound be fed directly into the camera by a cable to ensure best sound. You will have to determine first your camera input type before continuing with how to connect your sound. If your camera has a mini-XLR input, use a mini-XLR to XLR cable to connect your camera to your sound mixer. If your camera has a 3.5mm input, use a 3.5mm to CLR cable to connect to your mixer. Be sure to check that the volume level from the mixer is not too loud for the camera. Most cameras have an informational display for sound level.	
Pool Deck	The pool deck should be free of any removable objects such as training equipment, bags, towels, etc.	
Sponsor Banners	Federations can use sponsorship banners around the pool deck during their routine filming. Sponsors cannot conflict with FINA Partners. If you have any questions concerning your sponsors, please consult FINA.	
Compulsory Considerations	Videos that do not meet the minimum requirements will not be accepted for entry to the competition. Federations will be notified and given the opportunity to re-submit: • Video must be filmed in landscape mode (horizontal) • All limbs of all athletes on the screen at all times • No talking or noise must be heard other than music • NO major glare which would prevent judges from accurately seeing the routine must be present	

Performance Window & Submitting Your Routine

What is the performance window?	A 60-minute period, pre-selected by each federation on the established competition days, within which the routine must be performed and filmed, and submitted to the independent production company supplied by the Organizing Committee.
How to Schedule: Confirming Performance Windows	The form to confirm the chosen performance windows is <u>available on the event</u> <u>page</u> and must be submitted before February 17 , 2022 . Performances can be scheduled any time during this window, but not outside of it.
Submitting Videos	The performance videos must be uploaded to our independent production partner using the link that will be provided by email to participating federations (with the identification code). The upload must begin within the allotted one-hour window, and any issues with the upload attempt must be reported within that timeframe to Stephane Cote at stephane@ artisticswimming.ca.
Numerical Identification Code	A special code will be delivered to you one hour before the start of your selected performance window, at the email address specified in the <u>performance window selection form</u> .
	This code will need to be written on a sheet of paper and held in front of the camera at the beginning (before the full walk on) and end (after everyone has been filmed getting out of the water and has gone back on the start platform) of your continuous, non-edited video.



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
